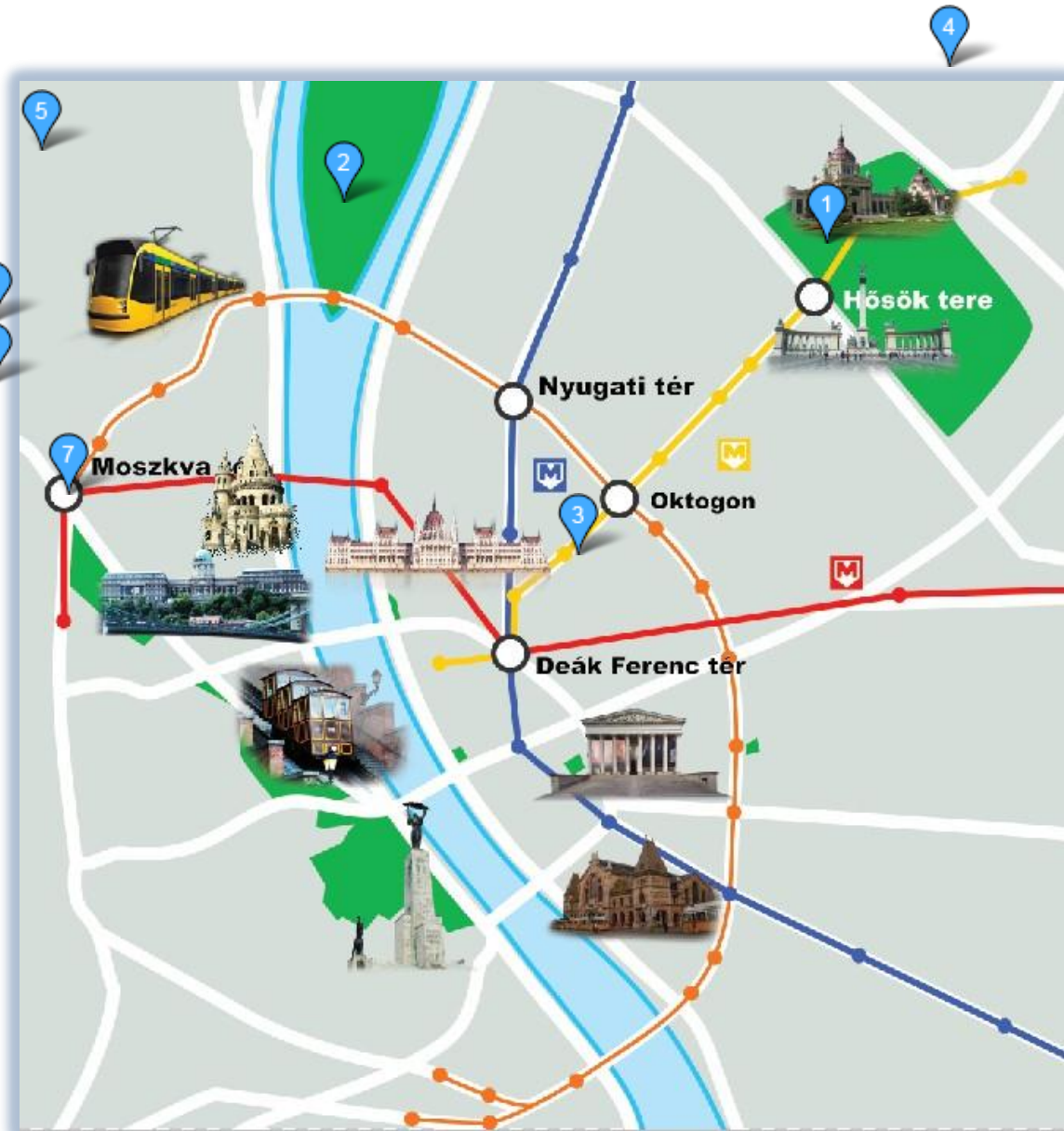


Budapest Family Weekend

1 Budapest Zoo

Budapest Zoo is near Heroes Square, very close the circus, Gundel Restaurant (if you are in the money), Szechenyi Spa and several museums. It is probably a good idea to spend an entire day in this area. In the winter there is even an ice rink in the neighbourhood. Most of the enclosures are what you can walk through, like giant greenhouses with tropical creatures and birds in..



3 Puppet Theatre

The Budapest Puppet Theatre (Bábszínház) is a fantastic attraction for kids in the city. While the shows are presented in Hungarian, kids are still enthralled by the enactment of familiar stories such as Cinderella and Snow White and can often be heard calling out warnings when villains are approaching or encouraging the heroes in their endeavours.



2 Margaret island

The island was dominated by nunneries, churches and cloisters until the 16th century. During the Ottoman wars the monks and nuns fled and the buildings were destroyed. In the 18th century it was chosen to be the resort of palatines. It was declared a public garden in 1908.

There is an excellent rubber-coated jogging track going around the island (5350 meters, marked by every 500 meters).



4 AquaWorld Water Theme Park

One of the biggest indoor water theme parks in Europe offers unforgettable entertainment to visitors of every age throughout the year.

The adventure centre is covered by a giant dome, 5-storey high and of a diameter of 72 m. It is so big it could host comfortably a family of blue whales, the biggest animals on Earth.



5 Palvolgyi Stalactite Cave

It is Hungary's third longest cave rich in dripstone and stalagmite structures. The underground trip took over 2.5 hours, with a great guide (fluent English, fun, and considerate), great sights, and a nice sense of adventure. The cave is not difficult, hand rails and steps in where needed. The guide shares both geological info and funny stories about the history and names of each of the sections.



7 Palace of Wonder

The Palace of Wonders is not a museum, not an exhibition, school nor a playhouse or a covered theme park. However, some features of all of these can be found in it. The visitors may play with the equipment shown, experiment with them, learn of the laws of nature, and realize how wonderful our world is. May run a race with the virtual champion, may see the secrets of his/her body with a heat camera and try out dozens of equipment and tests.



6 Children's railway

The 11 km ride through the forest something that You wont forget. This is a really nice way to spend a few hours in the Buda hills. It is fantastic to see the children all dressed in their railway uniforms, taking their roles very seriously, but having fun too. It is a very pleasant journey for both adults and children.



8 Janos Hill

When you climb Elizabeth Tower at the top of Janoshegy, the views in all directions are stunning. Children's Railway. You then get off from Children's railway at station "Janoshegy" and walk for about a kilometre, a gentle uphill trek to Elisabeth Tower for great views of Budapest and the Buda Hills before going back on yourself to the foot of the tower to catch the „Libego” chairlift back down the hill and finally bus 291 back into central Budapest.
